Presentation of RRA Citizen of the Year Award

Ms. Hollander thanked everyone for this honor. Mayor Ford noted there is a plaque at Village Hall commemorating this honor.

Trustee Jamerson moved to approve the minutes of the December 7, 2021 Board of Trustees meeting and Public Hearing. Trustee Dikin seconded the motion. The motion passed by the following vote:

Treasurer and Finance Committee Report

Village Treasurer Hal Roseth reported the Village has accumulated a nice cash position. Investment Advisor Danielle would like the Village investments to extend out 2-3 years. The Village's overall portfolio yield is at 1.47 percent and the Village has \$5 million in cash. Mr. Roseth believes the Village will maintain the current average yield rate. Mayor Ford asked for a year-end presentation in the first quarter of 2022.

Trustee Clayton noted the November financial reports will be sent out when they are ready.

Director of Community Services Report

Mr. Kraly will send out letters regarding the hazardous tree survey. He is working on making changes to the fee schedule and will have it ready next month.

Attorney's Report

Mr. Huvard has worked on technical issues with the people looking at the 37 acres. He is looking for solutions so they will annex into the Village.

Engineer's Report

1. National Pollution Discharge Elimination System Presentation

Karolina Cho, Wetland Specialist with Gewalt Hamilton presented a report on the NPDES. She explained that MS4 is necessary to keep stormwater clean and the environment healthy. The NPDES requires a permit for the discharge of stormwater. The permit requires four minimum control measures including public education and outreach, public involvement, illicit discharge detection and elimination, construction site stormwater runoff control, post-construction stormwater management for new development and redevelopment and pollution prevention for municipal operations.

Trustee Hollander noted there will be a Public Hearing in February regarding the resurfacing of Saunders Road.

Plan Commission Report

Ch. Laurie Breitkopf reported the Plan Commission recommended approval of the application at 240 Saunders Road.

Police Report

Chief Dayno indicated the police report is attached to the end of the minutes.

<u>Information items from the President</u>

1. Phase II of the Heritage Flatwoods Center

Mayor Ford noted the Village will look at Phase II at next year and will explore grants for the project. Trustee Jamerson noted some Riverwoods residents have expressed an interest in a play yard.

2. Update on Website Development

Trustee Dikin reported the new Village website is moving very quickly. There was a premature website launch last Friday. She provided a quick demonstration of the site, which is much more intuitive than the previous site.

New Business

1. Approval of a Service Contract with Resource Environmental Solutions (RES) for 2022 woodland stewardship program on village properties for \$31,237

Mayor Ford noted this is part of the ten-year plan.

2. Approval of the 2022 Budget

Trustee Clayton presented the information included in the Board packet, which was built up from individual financial accounts and the financial workshop. In summary, the operating budget for the General Fund shows a surplus for 2022. Revenue is up and expenditures are up less, due to the reclassification of the snow plowing expense to the MFT fund. Trustee Jamerson asked about the sewer and water fund inconsistencies. Mayor Ford explained this is a guideline for the Village.

Trustee Jamerson moved for approval of the 2022 budget. Trustee Hollander seconded the motion. The motion passed by the following vote:

3. Ordinance Amending Provisions of Article D of Chapter 5 of the Riverwoods Zoning Ordinance Concerning the Office and Research Compatible District

Mr. Huvard explained this is the Center for Holistic Medicine property, located at 240 Saunders Road. The property, which used to be a house, was annexed into the Village. The Village created an exception for a medical office use in the residential area, adjoining a non-residential neighborhood and on a major street. Mr. Huvard noted the Comprehensive Plan recommends this parcel be zoned as Office Compatible.

Trustee Clayton moved to waive the First Reading of an Ordinance Amending Provisions of Article D of Chapter 5 of the Riverwoods Zoning Ordinance Concerning the Office and Research Compatible District. Trustee Jamerson seconded the motion. The motion passed by the following vote:

5. Resolution approving the purchase of a vacant strip of land adjoining South Robinwood Lane

1. Ordinance establishing the Class L liquor licenses in the Village of Riverwoods

Mr. Huvard noted the Trustees asked about the limitation on the display area for alcohol should be 10 percent of the floor area or the building perimeter. He does not believe the alcohol area would be excessive if the perimeter was considered rather than the floor area. Mr. Huvard noted the conditions could be adjusted in the future if the Village believes there is a problem.
